Presenter: Molly Steinwald Executive Director, Environmental Learning Center Last Child in the Woods, by Richard Louv

A startling fact: by the 1990s the radius around the home where children were allowed to roam on their own had shrunk to a ninth of what it had been twenty years earlier. Join us for a review and discussion of Richard Louv's groundbreaking work, Last Child in the Woods: Saving our Children from Nature-Deficit Disorder. Molly Steinwald, Executive Director of the Environmental Learning Center, will present her review of this forward looking work at the AAUW Vero Beach Book Review Breakfast and Discussion. Child advocacy expert Louv directly links the lack of nature in children's, lives - he calls it nature deficit - to some of the most disturbing childhood trends, such as rises in obesity, attention deficit disorder, and depression. (From Amazon.com): "Today, average 8 year olds are better able to identify cartoon characters than native species, such as beetles and oak trees, in their own community. The rate at which doctors prescribe antidepressants to children has doubled in the past five years, and recent studies show that too much computer time spells trouble for the developing mind." Last Child in the Woods is the first book to bring together cutting edge research showing that direct exposure to nature is essential for healthy childhood development - physical, emotional, and spiritual. Environment-based education directly improves standardized test scores and grade point averages and develops skills in problem solving, critical thinking, decision making and creativity. Yet weaning kids from their plugged in and turned on world faces difficulty: fear of strangers, more and more homework assigned by schools, and less and less access to natural areas. This book is a first step to remedying that.

Molly Steinwald has nearly twenty years of experience teaching and managing projects in ecology, conservation biology and environmental education. Prior to joining the ELC, Molly served as Director of Science Education and Research at Phipps Conservatory and Botanical Gardens in Pittsburgh, PA. Ms. Steinwald is an accomplished educator, scientist and nature photographer with interests ranging from physiology to ecology to molecular biology to plant-people interactions. Molly has a passion for the importance of people living in harmony with nature in their everyday lives and will provide an exceptional view into Mr. Louv 's book. In today 's world where electronics seems to permeate all our lives, don 't miss an opportunity to hear, not only about the problem but also about practical solutions.


