

Walk in Their Shoes tell's the true story of the author and his colleagues who created BuildOn, an organization that turns inner—city teens into community leaders at home, and builds schools in impoverished areas abroad. BuildOn students have contributed more than 1.2 million hours of service, from Detroit and the South Bronx to Haiti, Maki and Nepal, while building more than five hundred fifty schools worldwide. Together, they are breaking the cycle of poverty, illiteracy, and low expectations in their own lives and transforming their communities. http://www.BuildOn.org tells more of this story.



A Movie Fundraiser

Our annual fundraiser is the Book Author Luncheon. For the past two years, we've created a second fundraiser to balance our budget. In 2014, we put on **Senior Moments** at the Theater Guild. In 2015, we imported **Tea for Three** to the Emerson Center. This year, our second fundraising event will be a movie—**Girl Rising**—on Saturday, January 23, 2016 at 2pm at the Majestic Theater.

This documentary brings us nine unforgettable girls from nine countries who were born into unforgiving circumstances. The film captures their dreams, their voices, and their remarkable lives, focusing on their struggle to get an education.

Proceeds from this event will allow us to buy multiple licenses for the film so it can be shown in multiple venues. Our local high schools are first on the list: Indian River Charter High School, Sebastian River High School, and Vero Beach High School are excited about showing the film free of charge to their students!

To make this event happen, we need volunteers:

Raise funds – Send packets to prospective sponsors, follow up, fol

Advertise – Ask shops to display posters; place ads in newspapers and online;
